OCTOBER IS BULLYING PREVENTION MONTH

Each year in October, school divisions across Virginia emphasize the importance of anti-bullying measures and focus on kindness. Bullying can contribute to increases in school absenteeism, mental and physical stress, poor school performance, low self-



esteem, and in some cases, school violence. Statistics show that children who experience bullying are at an increased risk for depression, anxiety, sleep difficulties, lower academic achievement, and dropping out of school (Centers for Disease Control 2021).

Throughout the month of October, our schools will provide several special activities including classroom lessons on bullying, morning announcements about bullying, a class poster contest, a "Bulldogs Aren't Bullies" banner, a compliment contest, "Wear Blue" spirit day, teambuilding activities, and a student "Be An Upstander" contest at the middle school. Our goal is to help bring a focus on treating others with kindness and respect.
