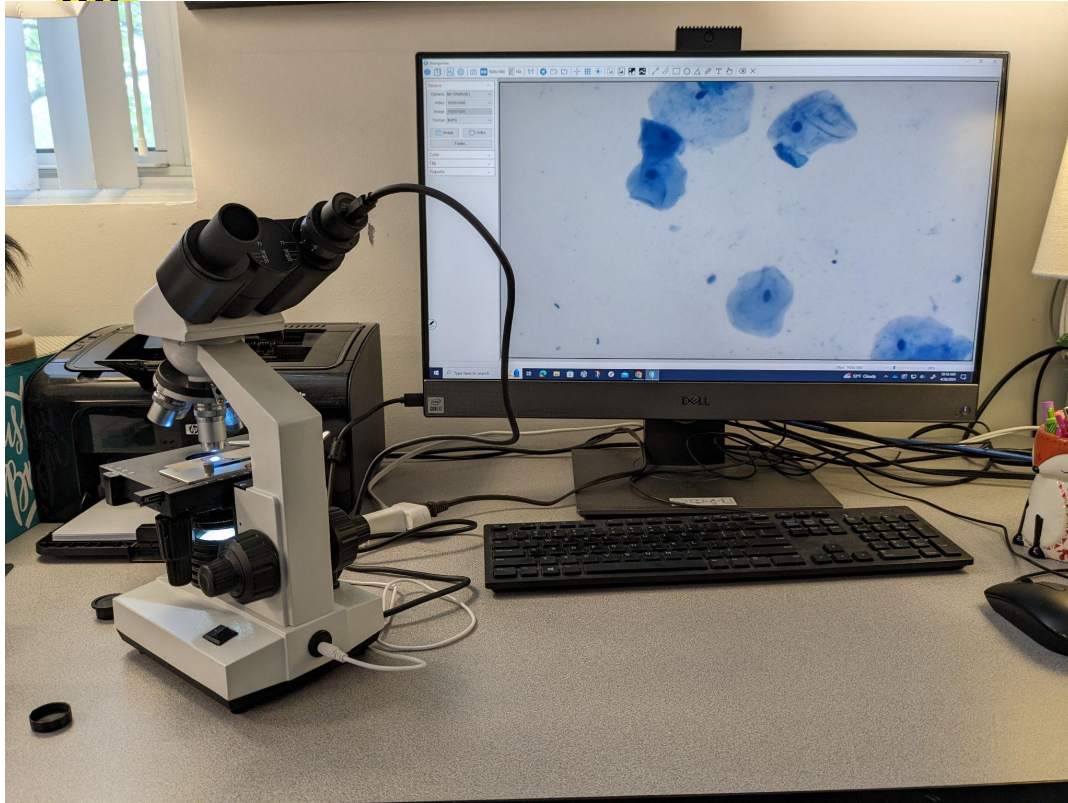


Digital Microscope

Connects to the computer! Shows students exactly what to look for



In the past, it's been challenging to know if students are seeing the correct images in the microscope. It was hard to find photos online that matched our activities. Because of this, it was hard to know if a student successfully focused a microscope and observed the correct cells.

With the digital microscope, I can now show students exactly what focusing looks like. They can see the cells they are supposed to find. (cheek cells stained with methylene blue shown here). Perhaps more importantly, I can show them what dust and air bubbles look like so they don't mistake them for cells.
