Students at LDMS invited their families to an "Academic Showcase" event to celebrate learning and achievement across content areas. Students and teachers selected projects, assignments, and activities to showcase during an open house event at the school in February. Some of the projects and assignments included genetic



snowmen, arcade games created with simple machines, poetry collections, coding activities, ceramics projects, and foreign language projects.



ATTENDANCE MATTERS

As you know, strong school attendance is extremely important for our students and for our schools. Students need to be in school to learn and engage with each other. While we have seen some improvements in attendance this year, we still have room to grow, and we need help from everyone to meet our goals.

Regular and on-time student attendance allows your student to get the most out of the school experience. The elementary school day begins at 8:00AM, and the middle school school day begins at

8:15AM. As a reminder, a doctor's note or court note is required after a student accumulates 15 absences. A student is considered "chronically absent" when they are absent 10% of the school year (missing 17 days). Our schools' state accreditation is tied to chronic absenteeism, and we are required by the State to follow up regularly with families regarding any school attendance concerns. LEXINGTON CITY SCHOOLS CELEBRATES SOLAR ECLIPSE ON APRIL 8
