Our nurses' clinics are stocked with free COVID testing kits for staff and student families. If you are in need of a testing kit,





ATTENDANCE MATTERS

As you know, strong school attendance is so important for your student and for our schools. While we have seen some improvements in overall attendance this fall, we still have room to grow, and we need everyone's support.

Regular and on-time student attendance allows your student to get the most out of the school experience. The elementary school day begins at 8:00AM, and the middle school school day begins at 8:15AM. As a reminder, a doctor's note or court note is required

after a student accumulates 15 unexcused absences. A student is considered "chronically absent" when they are absent 10% of the school year (missing 17 days). Our schools' state accreditation is tied to chronic absenteeism, and we are required by the State to follow up regularly with families regarding any school attendance concerns.
