 - a school Open House is scheduled in August/September of each school year
 - kindergarten registration/orientation is scheduled in the Spring of each school year
- D. H. Waddell Elementary School involves parents, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's Title I, Part A program, including the planning, review, and improvement of the school Parent and Family Engagement Policy, and the process of the school review and improvement, in the following ways;

invitation to upcoming important school dates and activities, and the establishment of parental communication preference (email, telephone, notes home). The ELL teacher follows up with parents within the first week of the student attending school.

- Parents of English Learners are encouraged to read with their children daily. They receive a daily bag with notes from the ELL teacher, along with books and study materials for the student to share with parents
- Communication is made frequently depending on student and family need, and on a weekly basis from the classroom teacher through a Monday student folder which parents sign and return
- Parents are encouraged to have their children participate in extracurricular activities, school/PTA sponsored events, tutoring and summer programs in the community with scholarships sought when necessary
- Parents are given information and encouraged to attend English lessons provided through community groups
- Translation services, including translation of documents and meetings, are provided by the ELL teacher and through local community services
- F. H. Waddell Elementary School provides parents of participating children:
 - (1) timely information about Title I programs:
 - on the school website
 - by distribution of the Parent and Family Engagement Policies
 - at the annual parent involvement meeting in the Fall of each school year
 - (2) a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet;

In addition, if the Title I, Part A grant and annual plan is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, Lexington City Schools will submit any parent comments with the application when the plan is submitted to the State.
